In his *Musical Mystery Tour* presentation, music educator Chuck Speicher guided students through the history of music from the Renaissance through the Classic period, relating themes from composers of movie scores like John Williams to the first operas.



Using a multimedia approach, he also engaged the children in role-play, always emphasizing the connection that thematic music plays in the telling of the story. The sold-out program was jam-packed with information, but the students were so engrossed and enjoying themselves, they didn't even notice how much they were learning!
