This presentation introduces a variety of techniques that help musicians, actors and public speakers cope with stage fright. The effects of the body’s acute stress response are examined in detail, with several hands-on exercises which work for students as well as professional performers. This session is a good introduction to the causes of performance anxiety and the most effective solutions for long-term anxiety management.

Vanessa Cornett is Director of Keyboard Studies and Associate Professor of Music at the University of St. Thomas in Minneapolis-St. Paul where she teaches classes in music performance, teaching, mindfulness, and the contemplative nature of art and music.

Irina Morozova has given master classes in the US, Italy, Germany, Russia, Hong Kong and has taught and performed at the International Keyboard Institute and Festival in NYC, Cremona International Music Academy (Italy), InterHarmony Festival (Germany), Music Mountain and Caramoor Festivals (USA). Since 1996 she has been on the faculties of Mannes College of Music and the Special Music School at Kaufman Center.

Born to a musical family, Irina Morozova began her musical studies at the Saint Petersburg Special Music School for Gifted Children and the Rimsky-Korsakov College of Music. Ms. Morozova received her Master of Music degree from the Manhattan School of Music and was a top prize-winner of the New Orleans, the Frinna Awerbuch, and the San Antonio International Piano Competitions.



President's Message

Why I Love MEA Presents...!



I love being a part of the MEA-NJ community of piano teachers and music lovers! Since being president, I have joyously hosted all of our fantastic MEA Presents... Attending these presentations has helped to motivate me and rejuvenate the way I teach and play. Learning and applying musical gems of advice from our esteemed presenters have allowed me to grow as a teacher and person as well.

At the February Zoom only MEA Presents...*The Perils of Practice: How to Make Practice More Purposeful and Productive*, Victor Rosenbaum shared clever and creative ideas to make playing more pleasurable and fun, especially for beginner students. These are some of his suggestions: "Play a scale as a waltz. Make up a song for a scale; put words to it."

The idea that scales can be pleasurable and fun was a revolution to me! I realized that I was teaching scales to my beginner students the way I was taught: that scales were an essential part of technique and finger discipline. Scales were a requirement and absolutely necessary. Scales were important. SCALES WERE NOT FUN!

Later that afternoon, I put Victor's sage advice into action with my younger students by accompanying them while they played their scales as a waltz and playing a scale as a song, too. They loved it! And so did I! This little change in teaching beginner students scales has made a huge impact on me. My intention is to apply the mindset of playing scales and yes, technique, too, in a more engaging and creative way for ALL my students, not just beginners.

The event of the solar eclipse inspired me to teach all of my students to improvise based on visualizing the eclipse. I also had a hunch that this little activity would be a fun way to teach and implement the whole tone scale and the natural and harmonic minor scale, too. My hunch was right! My students were delighted to explore these scales with playfulness and enthusiasm.

I am thankful that I can continue my pedagogical education by attending the MEA Presents...presentations and incorporating what I've learned to my teaching and playing.

I invite everyone to become a part of our MEA community and join me at the next MEA Presents...!

"Life begins at 90," Seymour Bernstein told us at the celebrations of that occasion in April, 2017. Seven years later, he continues to live up to the promise. "Look at that," he recently said in wonderment at a lesson I had with him, as the passagework of Schubert's Impromptu in A-flat major bubbled out of his hand with total ease. "I never used to be able to do that when I was younger. Killed myself trying to do it when I was 16. Now I just let it happen." With old age comes wisdom and the things that really matter come into focus. For Mr. Bernstein, that's tending to music, the inner reservoir that has sustained him for a lifetime, and passing on what he knows to students all over the world. The internet makes it possible.

Mr. Bernstein continues to maintain a busy teaching schedule. He presented a masterclass and a lecture at the NJ-MEA annual conference in Princeton last November. He has contributed many recordings to Tonebase, an internet forum about playing piano, and he will teach at their first summer camp at the Adamant School in Vermont this coming August.

Sondra Tammam taught *Piano Pedagogy - Exploring the Taubman Approach* at Montclair State University.

Birgit Matzerath performed piano music by J.S. Bach at the Millburn Library as part of the annual Bach-in-the-Subways project.

In March, **Jackie Schiller** performed works by Bach, Granados, Chopin, Schubert, Liszt, and Beethoven in the Society Cafe Concert Series in Ridgewood.

Beatrice Long performed a recital and offered master classes at the National Taiwan Normal University and at Soochow University. She led a master class on 'Études' at the Third Street Music School, NYC and judged the 'Young Artists Competition' of the Tuesday Musical Club in San Antonio, TX. **Beatrice Long** and **Christina Long** presented Mozart's *Concerto for Two Pianos* with the Sun Taipei Philharmonic Orchestra, Taipei, Taiwan, and 'Silver Lining' Recital for Two Pianos and master classes at Lingenfelter Artists Series at McPherson College, KS.

Patricio Molina directed a concert in March at the historic Newark Symphony Hall, spotlighting Black and Latino composers, with students and alumni from the Newark School of the Arts. Included in the program were two pieces by Patricio: *Bolero* and the premiere of *Dominican Suite* for piano and beatboxer.

Nancy Modell presented a 5-hour pre-conference workshop on improv and creative composing, and a conference session, *Lesser-Known Gems for Children by American Women Composers*, at the 2024 Suzuki Association of the Americas Conference in Louisville, KY in March.

Sophia Agranovich was a featured artist on the radio podcast "Lite Lounge with Dimitri K". She was a recipient of One Earth Awards: Best Classical Music Recording for her new release *Album Leaf: Piano Works by Felix Mendelssohn*, receiving glowing reviews in the March-April Issue of the American Record Guide, Artisan Music Reviews, and The Whole Note, along with two medals for Outstanding Achievement from Global Music Awards. She was a winner of the *Best Classical Piano Album* at the Clouzine International Music Awards and won the *Best Classical Artist* at the World Entertainment Awards in CA.

Ingrid Clarfield received the 2024 Music Teachers National Association Distinguished Service Award at the MTNA Conference in March in Atlanta, GA.


